Marathwada Mitra Mandal's Institute of Technology organized a visit to Aniket Sevabhavi Sanstha, Lavasa Road, Mulsi, Pune, to create social awareness among students and understand the requirements of the BE Project for mentally challenged people.

ANIKET Sevabhavi Sanstha is a secular organisation dedicated to the welfare and rehabilitation of children whose only fault is to have been born without normal facilities. ANIKET Sevabhavi Sanstha is a residential institution run by a group of people who work tirelessly towards sheltering differently abled children/ special children and adults who are mentally challenged for life. At ANIKET, the rejects of the society are given not just refuge for life, but love, care and education by individuals whose only mission is to make the lives of these children whole

The ANIKET Sevabhavi Sanstha journey began out of the determination and ambition of Ms. Kalpana Varpe to provide refuge, rehabilitation, education and most importantly, a place to call home for the children of the section of society who are deemed 'mentally retarded', rejected abandoned by their families.

Kalpana Tai is herself a mother of one such special child. The experiences she went through with her own son has driven her to become the lighthouse of many such children. Her unfettered determination, hard work and selfless efforts are responsible for helping scores of individuals from the age of 4 years to 46 years in the format of a residential rehabilitation center and school.

Currently, there are more than 60 special children staying in an orphan home aniket seva bhavi sanstha. These children are deemed mentally retarded and abandoned by a part of society. Ms. Kalpana Varpe and staff members of Aniket seva bhavi sanstha nurturers and educates these children.

Teaching staff and students visited and donated groceries to children as well as had interaction with Ms. Kalpana Varpe regarding their motive and work.
